SATHAYE COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) 2022-2023

Sathaye College; formerly called Parle College, was established in 1959 by Parle Tilak Vidyalaya Association. The college is permanently affiliated to the University of Mumbai for the courses leading to B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.Sc. (I.T.), B.M.S., B.A.M.M.C (Marathi), M.Sc.(I.T.), M.Sc.(Chemistry / Botany) and M.A. (Hindi, Buddhist Studies). The Courses for B.F.M., B.A.F., M.Com, MAEMA and M.Sc. (Data Science) are being introduced from 2022-23.

The advantages for a college becoming autonomous

As per the rules and standards set by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), any college with a score of 3.51 or above (on a scale of 4) or with A grade for 3 consecutive cycles is eligible to become an autonomous college.

An Autonomous college has many advantages as well as flexibility in many important aspects of its functioning such as :

- It can design its own curriculum to make it more useful for its students and ensure that it meets the future demands of any course as per the requirements of the industry and services.
- The college can plan and implement its own examination pattern which will help in the proper evaluation of its students through modes such as continuous internal assessments, field visits, minor research projects, industrial and research institute visits, etc, in a time-bound manner. Such flexibility is not easy to have in a non-autonomous college, in which the examination and evaluation process has to function as per the parent University guidelines which are often very rigid.

INFORMATION REGARDING COURSES:

1. Students should note that they will not be permitted to change subject/ s once offered.

- 2. Provision for teaching various subjects depends upon the availability of a minimum number of 24 students offering that subject at the point of entry. In case the minimum number is not available, the students will be permitted to change their subjects in conformity with the scheme given below.
- 3. Students from other states / Foreign countries who have not studied any one of compulsory second language (Other than English) offered at the F.Y.B.A. level in this University are allowed to continue their studies at F.Y.B.A. by offering one more subject under the social science / Humanities Group of subject in the place of compulsory second Languages in addition to the three optional papers.

- Subject I : Foundation Course I / N.C.C. Studies I/II

N.B.: Before selecting Subjects IV, V and VI students should note that at present, the college does not have Sociology, Psychology and Sanskrit at the T.Y.B.A. level.

- Subject V : **Select any one subject from the following:** Political Science, Ancient Indian Culture (A.I.C.), Geography, Philosophy.

A student is required to select five subjects as given below:

- a) Foundation course II / N.C.C. Studies III/IV
- b) Two papers in each of the three optional subjects offered at F.Y.B.A. (as per the scheme available in this college)
- c) General Applied component (one paper)

T.Y.B.A (Sem V and Sem VI)

- 1) A student is required to select one Major subject with 6 papers or two Major subjects with 3 papers each. The Major subject should be one/two of the optional subjects offered by the student at S.Y.B.A. Each paper will carry 100 marks. Total marks 600.

- A student is required to select three science subjects of two units each and also one paper in Foundation Course/ N.C.C. studies I/II. Each unit of an experimental subject will carry one paper of 100 marks. The practical examination of 100 marks. Each unit of a non-experimental subject will carry one paper of 100 marks.
- 2. A student is permitted to select any one of the following groups.
 - Chemistry Botany Zoology (i) _ -(ii) Chemistry **Mathematics** _ Physics (iii) Chemistry Microbiology* Botany --(iv) Physics Mathematics Statistics -_ (v) Physics Botany AND Chemistry --Foundation Course - I / N.C.C. Studies

* The subject of Microbiology is given strictly on the basis of merit decided by the aggregate marks obtained in H.S.C. examination. The merit list will be displayed within one month of commencement of college.

S.Y. B. Sc. (Sem III & Sem IV)

A student is required to select Seven papers as under :

Two Science subjects offered at F.Y.B.Sc. (as per the scheme available in this college) and Foundation course II / N.C.C. Studies III/IV. Each unit of an experimental subject will carry one paper of 100 marks. The practical examination of 50 marks for each course (Each unit of a non-experimental subject will carry one paper of 100 marks).

A student may offer any one of the following groups.

- a) Chemistry and Botany
- b) Chemistry and Zoology
- c) Chemistry and Physics
- e) Botany and Zoology
- d) Chemistry and Microbiology
- g) Mathematics and Statistics.
- f) Physics and Mathematics

1) A student is required to select any one of the following subjects as his/ her Major subject. The Major subject shall be one of the science subjects offered by the student in the S.Y.B.Sc. Class.

Mathematics, Statistics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Microbiology papers of Theory. Each theory course is of 100 marks & practical's, each of 50 marks.

2) In addition to the above, each student shall offer one papers of a subject under the Applied Component Group

The details of the same will be given as per university guidelines which shall be received in due course.

FEES : Eligibility for fee concession (Aided & Unaided)

- Students belonging to E.B.C. and those who are children of Primary School Teachers, (P.T.C.), Freedom Fighters (F.F), S.S.C.D.Ed. Teachers' (SST) are **eligible for fee concession**, provided they produce documentary evidence to that effect. Such students are required to apply for Scholarship or Free Studentship as per dates prescribed by the Principal, failing which they have to pay full fees.
- 2. Students belonging to the Backward Classes are **eligible for fee concession** but they are required to submit the Caste Certificate, Caste Validity Certificate, Income Certificate from Tahsildar, Non-Creamy Layer Certificate for OBC / NT / EBC only issued by the Competent Authority in the State of Maharashtra.

(Students belonging to other States are not eligible for any fee concession)

- * Students of T.Y.B.Com. class offering Computer System and Industrial Psychology will have to pay an additional Fees ₹ 3,000/- as Practical Fee.
- * Caution Money, Library deposit, Laboratory deposit and Enrolment Fee will be paid by new entrants only.
- * Students should claim their amount of Caution Money, Library Deposit and Lab Deposits within three years from the date of leaving the college, otherwise the same will be forfeited.

REFUND OF FEES: (Aided & Unaided Courses)

 Rules in respect of refund of fees as per University of Mumbai Circular No. UG/412 of 2008 dt. 11th September 2008.

0.2859: Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admissions: The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in Govt. colleges, In Govt. aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges, and recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation and thereafter. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

NOTE: The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the courses includes the following:-

- i) All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- ii) The Fee charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be paid as University share (including Vice-Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster, management fund, exam fee and Enrollment fee) are non-refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
- iii) Fee collected for Identity Card and Library Card, Admission Form and Prospectus, Enrollment and any other course specific fee **are not refundable** after the commencement of the academic term.
- iv) All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) **shall be fully returned** at the time of cancellation.
- 2. All cases which do not fall under point 1 above shall be within the discretion of the Principal.
- 3. If the last day for submission of application for the refund of fees falls on Sunday or a public holiday, the next day shall be deemed to be the last day for the purpose.
- 4. Identity Card and the Reader's Tickets, if issued, and the Fee Receipt shall be surrendered along with the application for discontinuation and refund of fees.
- 5. Collect the cancellation fees on or before 30th Sept. 2022 on any college working day, <u>between 10 am and 12 noon</u>.

0.119 : Attendance :

The following shall be the minimum attendance necessary for keeping terms.

Faculty of Arts/Sc./Com.: Three-Fourths of the number of days on which lectures are delivered in each term.

(N.B.: A day's attendance means attendance at all the lectures, tutorials, seminars and practical's according to the regular class time-table for the day.)

0.125: To keep terms, an undergraduate must complete, to the satisfaction of the Principal, the course of study at the college prescribed for such terms for the class to which undergraduate then belongs.

Students who fail to satisfy the conditions laid down by 0.119 and 0.125 will not be permitted to appear at the examinations.

Scholarship "Raj Shri Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Merit Scholarship" (7) Other Backward Class Scholarships.

FREE-STUDENTSHIPS:

(1) Economically Backward class Free-studentship, (2) Free-studentship to children of Primary School Teachers, (3) Free-Studentship to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes Students; (4) Educational Concessions to the Children, Wives and Widows of the defence Service Personnel, (5) Educational Concessions to the children of Freedom Fighters, (6) Educational Concessions to the Children of Teachers in Secondary Schools, (7) Free Studentship to Girls.

- 2. Students applying for Scholarships/ Free studentships should note that these are granted on the following conditions :
 - a) That the applicant is regular in attendance in accordance with the conditions governing the respective Scholarship/ Free-studentship.
 - b) That his/ her conduct and progress are satisfactory, and
 - c) that he/ she is not absent without prior permission.

FOR RESERVED CATEGORY STUDENTS:

All the students of reserved category who want to avail the Fee concession for the admission to different courses, should note that following documents are to be submitted compulsorily at the time of admission.

- 1) Caste Certificate and Caste Validity Certificate from competent Govt. authorities.
- 2) Income Certificate from Tahsildar.
- 3) For OBC / NT / SBC students Non Creamy Layer Certificate is required.
- 4) Aadhaar Card.

In case these documents are NOT submitted in due course they are liable to pay balance fee. Students who are interested in availing of Fee concession should fill up the Freeship form in 15 days after the admission. (Vide circular from special Dist. Officer of Social Welfare, Mumbai Region Circular No. VGS KA/MUM UP/BH SSHI/07-08 dated 23/06/2007).

In order to avail of Scholarship/Freeship facility the students are required to fill up the application form online. They are also required to submit the printout of the said application along with required documents in the college office.

RULES CONCERNING ADMISSION:

Admissions to F.Y.B.A. / F.Y.B.Sc. / F.Y.B.Com. classes will start after the declaration of the H.S.C. examination results. Admission to other classes will start after the declaration of the results of the respective qualifying examinations. All the admission will be on the online mode. The procedure for the same will be notified on website and the hard copy will be supplied along with this prospectus.

- 1. Student seeking admission should apply online during the hours notified for the purpose.
- 2. Every student has to upload his/her photograph on the Admission form.
- 3. No admission shall be regarded as duly granted unless it is granted by the authority of the Principal and the necessary fees have been received by the college.
- 4. All admissions are valid only for one academic year and are required to be renewed by application in the prescribed form for every subsequent year of study in the college.
- 5. Normally, a student of this college who has qualified himself/herself for admission to a higher class, will be admitted to such a class, provided an application for the purpose, in the prescribed form, duly filled in, has been received with the necessary fees within the notified period.
- 6. Once a student is admitted to the college he/she shall be liable to pay full fees for the whole term.

- 7. A student once admitted will be considered as duly enrolled for the academic year, unless he/she informs the Principal about the cancellation of the same in writing.
- 8. For admission to any class it is necessary to produce in original :
 - (a) Statement of Marks.
 - (b) Passing Certificate other than Maharashtra Board Students
 - (c) No Objection Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended in the case of students from other colleges joining the S.Y. and T.Y. classes.
 - (d) Eligibility Certificate from the University of Mumbai in the case of the students passing an examination other than the H.S.C. examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune or an Examination of any University other than the University of Mumbai, as the case may be.
- 9. Admission remains **provisional** until Migration Certificate/ Final Eligibility Certificate/ Passing Certificate / Transference Certificate is submitted to the college.
- 10. Student who fails to pay his/ her fees and other dues on the prescribed date will have to pay the fine as decided by the Principal.
- 11. The caution Money will be returned only on the dates notified by the college for the purpose. The prescribed form for the withdrawal of the Caution Money will be available in the college office.

Rules for admission to Semester I (F.Y.B.A. / F.Y.B.Sc. / F. Y. B. Com.)

- A student who has passed the H.S.C. Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune, or an Examination recognised equivalent thereto in Arts, Science or Commerce Stream or in bifocal Vocational Course, Technical Commerce Group or bifocal Vocational Course, under Technical Group/Commerce Group/or MCVC Technical Group/ Commerce Group will be eligible for admission to the F.Y.B.A. class.
- 2. A student who has passed the H. S. C. Examination conducted by the said Board or an Examination recognised equivalent thereto in Science Stream or in bifocal Vocational Course under Technical Group, will be eligible for admission to the F.Y.B. Sc. class.
- 3. A student who has passed the H. S. C. Examination conducted by the said Board in subjects English, a Modern Indian Language or Modern Foreign languages and any four subjects from among the subjects Economics, Book-Keeping and Accountancy, Organisation of Commerce, Geography, Mathematics & Statistics, Secretarial Practice, Cooperation or with English and any one vocational subject carrying 200 marks and three subjects from among the subjects under the Faculty of Commerce, each carrying 100 marks or who has passed the F.Y.B. Com. Examination under the "Old course", or an Examination recognised equivalent thereto, will be eligible for admission to the F.Y.B. Com. class.

- 4. Seats are reserved for Backward class Students as per Govt. Rules: Students belonging to the Backward Classes are required to submit the Caste Certificate issued by the Competent Authority in the State of Maharashtra.
- 5. 0.3933: A candidate who has passed post S.S.C. (Std. X) Three Year Engineering / Technology Diploma course is eligible for direct admission to Second Year of the B.Sc. degree course.

OR

Acandidate who has passed post H.S.C. Diploma (one year after XII Std.) of Maharashtra State Board of Technical Education or A.I.C.T.E. approved or any other recognized Government body in Information Technology / Computer Technology / Computer Engineering / Computer Science / Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches / Mechanical and Allied Branches / Production and Allied Branches / Chemical and Allied Branches is eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc. degree course.

Further that such students of Engineering / Technology courses should offer Foundation Course II/ N.C.C and any two of the following subject at S.Y.B.Sc. : Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics.

6. Eligibility:

Documents required for eligibility from students of Other State Board or University -

- a) XIIth Marksheet (Original & Photocopy)
- b) XIIth Passing certificate (Original & Photocopy)
- c) Migration Certificate (Original & Photocopy)
- d) Transfer Certificate or College Leaving Certificate (Original & Photocopy)

7. Rules for Admission to Semester III (S.Y.B.A. / S.Y. B.Com)

A student is eligible for admission to Semester III (S.Y. B.A. / S.Y. B.Com.)

1. If the Student passes each of Semester I and Semester II

OR

2. If the student fails in not more than two papers each in Semester I and Semester II.

- 2. The details regarding the examinations conducted by the college will be displayed on the notice-boards from time to time and website.
- 3. Promotion to the Second Year and Third Year classes will be on the basis of the performance at the First Year and Second Year examinations respectively, as per Sathaye College (Autonomous) Examination Policy adopted on 22nd December 2022.
- 4. Credit Based Evaluation System :
- 4(a) Scheme of Examinations (For F.Y., S.Y., T.Y. and P.G.)

The performance of the learners will be evaluated in two components.

- First component will be the Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) carrying 40% marks conducted by Head of the department.
- (2) Second component will be the semester wise Semester End Examination (SEE) carrying 60% marks conducted by Controller of Examinations.

Continuous internal assessment shall not be applicable for practical courses.

Semester End practical Examination for each practical course is conducted at the end of semester as per the direction given in the syllabus of the respective Board of Studies.

1. A student found to have used unfair means in the examination will be dealt with as per Examination Policy section 26 (Ordinance 5050)

2. STANDARD OF PASSING :

The standard of passing, rules of disqualification, rules of gracing and benefit of A.T.K.T. will be as prescribed by the Examination Policy of Sathaye College (Autonomous).

Passing Standard: To pass the course, learners shall have to obtain minimum 40% in internal and external examinations separately for each course.

For Science stream, theory examination & practical examination shall remain separate heads of passing.

3. Eligibility for Admission to all the Under Graduate Programs (aided and non-aided) in the Faculties of Arts and Commerce under Credit Based Semester and Grading System :

Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rule

- (A) A student shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number of heads of failure in the Semester I.

 - 1) He/she passes each semester-I and semester-II
 - 2) He/she fails in not more than two courses in each semester-I and II where the maximum total marks for semester is 900 or less.
 - 3) He/she fails in not more than three courses in each semester-I and II where the maximum total marks for semester is above 900.
- (C) A student shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-IV irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester-III.
- (D) A student shall be allowed to keep term for Semester- IV
 - 1) He/she passes each semester-I, II, III and IV.
 - 2) He/she passes semester-I and II and fails in not more than two courses in each semester-III and IV where the maximum total marks for semester is 900 or less.
 - 3) He/she passes semester-I and II and fails in not more than three courses in each semester-III and IV where the maximum total marks for semester is above 900.
 - 4) He/she passes semester-III and IV and fails in not more than two courses in each semester-I and II where the maximum total marks for semester is 900 or less.
 - 5) He/she passes semester-III and IV and fails in not more than three courses in each semester-I and II where the maimum total marks for semester is above 900.
- (E) A student shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester-V.

The college Library contains over 84,000 books. It is situated in a spacious hall on the first floor with seating arrangements for 180 students. The Lending Section of the Library is situated on the ground floor. The timings for circulation at lending section are 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.

It receives 108 periodicals related to the courses taught in the college.

The Library reading hall remains open for study, reference and issue of books from 7.00 a.m. to 6.15 p.m. on all working days. Any change in library hours is put up on the library notice board on regular basis.

Sathaye College Library aims at facilitating the better understanding of core-subjects of Mumbai University syllabus along with sensitization and awareness of current issues in society. The library has a vivid collection of books related to its syllabus of various courses namely B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., M.Sc. (Chemistry), M.Sc. (Botany),

B.M.S., B.M.M., B.Sc. (I.T.), M.Sc. (I.T.), M.A. (Hindi), M.A. (Buddhist Studies), and M.A.C.J. It has about 80,000 books on various subjects. 82 magazines and journals and nearly about 900 CD ROMs. 8000 Exclusive Reference Books. 12 Daily Newspapers, 1,010 Bound Volumes of Journals and 840 Films.

ABOUT THE LIBRARY

Sathaye College library was established in the year 1959 *i.e.* in the year when the college was established.

Initially, there was only Degree College Library with two faculties *viz.* Arts and Science. Since 1975 Junior College Library with all three faculties i.e. Arts. Commerce and Science was started. Further in 1980, **+2 Vocational Minimum Competency Courses** were introduced. In the year 1982-83 Commerce Faculty was introduced. The Degree Course for B.Sc. (I.T.) was introduced in Library Budget in the year 2002- 03.

The B.M.S. Degree course was started in the year 2003-04. B.M.M. course for Marathi Mass Media was introduced in the year 2010-11.

The collection of books on various subjects grew in number with the development of the college. So a separate Book Lending Section was developed in the year of 1985.

COLLECTION

The collection of the library includes - books in English, Hindi, Marathi, Gujarati, Sanskrit, German, French, Ardhamagadhi and Pali.

MEMBERSHIP (STUDENT MEMBERS)

Sathaye College students can avail membership after presenting appropriate identification document, a photograph and proof of residential address in Mumbai. Students must produce their current year I-Card whenever asked for. The members are provided with one Library Ticket for issuing Textbooks and Reference Books and one Reading Club Card for Leisure Reading. No extra fees is charged for this kind of membership. The members are expected to present these tickets while borrowing the books from the library. Patrons who wish to use the library for special purpose namely Competitive Exam Preparation, Career Guidance, borrowing CD ROMs from the library can make use of special Reading Club Card after paying fees of ₹ 250/- a year and caution money ₹ 500/-. These members are also provided with facility of internet surfing under UGC NRC. Patrons who wish to use the library only for reading-hall facility are not charged any kind of fees. The library is also open for Ex-Staff Members and Ex-Students by way of Special Reading Club Card. The Annual Fees for such Patrons is ₹ 250/- and Caution Money ₹ 500/-. Patrons who wish to use the library for a short period may make use of its services except borrowing privileges and internet facility.

HOW TO SEARCH FOR THE BOOKS IN THE LIBRARY

Card Catalogue helps the readers for locating relevant authors and titles in the collection. The cards of author and title indexes arc arranged in a Dictionary like manner so that they can be easily searched with their starting letters. Books and Journals are arranged on the shelves according to DDC 20th Edition.

COMPUTERIZED ACCESS

So as to facilitate the fast retrieval and search of the books, list of maximum books in the library are made available on the computer. The staff at the counter will assist for using these resources. Necessary instructions are available on screen for using the facilities.

ONLINE PUBLIC ACCESS CATALOG (OPAC)

The Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) provides members with a listing of all material available in the library, The OPAC can be searched by author, title, subject, call number, keyword and several other options. In addition to identifying the availability of a book in the library, the OPAC also indicates whether the book is available or checked out. Library staff will be happy to assist you in using OPAC effectively and locating the title you desire (The holdings of the library can also be accessed on the internet at <u>www.sathayecollege.edu.in</u>)

Readers can submit their grievances, complaints and suggestions to the authorities of the college by way of feedback in the complaint box and boxes at library. Co-operation of the readers is earnestly requested in observing the perfect discipline in the library.

GYMKHANA :

The College Gymkhana of which the Principal is the ex-officio President, is managed by the Chairman, who is nominated by the Principal. The Chairman is usually a senior member of the teaching staff. He/she conducts the activities of the Gymkhana with the assistance of various lecturers and Student Secretaries elected from among the students.

The Gymkhana aims at encouraging students to participate in sports, and at enhancing their sport / athletic.

It conducts various tournaments within the college and sends out students to represent the college in various Inter-collegiate and other competitions.

The Gymkhana provides a Reading Room for students.

Students participating in the Sports Events at Inter-University / Inter-State / National / Inter National level, are entitled to a maximum of 10 grace marks at their first attempt in the examinations, as laid down under **0.229-B**.

CAREER GUIDANCE

The library receives various pamphlets and booklets with information on Career-Guidance and Career Building. A separate cupboard has been created to preserve these pamphlets and books. The students are advised to browse through the pamphlets, internet sites, books etc. for getting clear perspective about particular career.

Health concerns come first:

For any person to be able to gain proper learning, they have to be in sound physical and mental health. Sometimes, students may suddenly have a health problem or a small injury while on our campus. A First-aid box is available in different parts of the college to provide them with immediate medical aid. In case of anything more serious, Doctors in the vicinity of our college are available on call. A Wheelchair and stretcher are also available in case of any emergency.

Yet, we would appeal to parents and students themselves that they make sure to eat something before they come to college in the mornings to avoid unnecessary weakness.

A student's mental health is very important. While our teachers deal with small issues that students may have about certain fears and anxieties and help them overcome those, some students could face more serious issues where they need professional assistance. Hence, we also have a professional Counsellor on campus every 3 days of the week to professionally guide students with more serious mental health issues. Prior appointment has to be sought before approaching the Counsellor.

For the women students, a Sanitary napkin vending and dispensing machine for women students is available in the Girls' Common room.

Our college also has a proper functioning Canteen guaranteeing nutritious food at a reasonable price even while catering to the changing tastes of students.

Our college has been running zero waste management policy for last five years and special infrastructure arrangement facilities like vermicompost pit and wet waste collection and composting pit.

Sathaye college has two NCC units that belong to Army wings. The unit aims to enroll the students who are willing to join the armed forces and civil services. It helps students to learn personality development qualities, team building activities, and participate in social activities as well. Our NCC cadets participate in the Republic Day Parade at the state and national level and also in various National and Regional camps. Our NCC unit has bagged University of Mumbai's Vice-Chancellor banner thrice in the year 2015, 2017 and 2018.

Sathaye college NSS unit gives the students an opportunity to develop the qualities of leadership and sense of social responsibility in them. The N.S.S. Unit of our College conducts regular and special camps, Blood donation drives, social awareness campaigns, personality development programmes etc. for the volunteers. Over a period of time, our NSS and NCC units have contributed in earning a significant recognition to college in Mumbai University.

Successful cadets are entitled to a maximum of 10 grace marks at their first attempt in the examinations, as laid down under **0.229-A**.

N.S.S. : Fee of ₹10/- for enrollment Intake seat 250

The N.S.S. unit gives the students an opportunity to develop the qualities of leadership and sense of social consciousness in them, Students are directed to different social institutions like homes for the blind, orphanages, general hospitals, etc., or to the nearby slum-areas to mitigate the sufferings of the persons there. COLLEGE REGULATIONS :

General:

1. Every student shall obtain on admission his/her Identity card from Librarian

The procedure for obtaining the identity card will be put up on the notice board. Every student shall submit to the librarian 4 copies of his / her latest photograph of 1 1/2" x 2" size, printed on glossy paper.

- 2. The student must always display the identity card with his / her photograph affixed there on and attested before entering the college premise. No student shall be allowed to attend classes practical's etc. unless he/she displays his/her Identity Card.
- 3. Students shall attend lectures, practical's, tutorials and seminars according to the regular Time-Table on all working days of the college. **Student shall not remain absent from lectures, practical's, tutorials, seminars and examinations without prior permission of the Principal.** Absence without prior leave may lead to loss of term, since to keep a term, a student has to complete, to the satisfaction of the Principal, the course of study prescribed for the term of the class to which he/ she belongs.

'Students are warned that, if their attendance at lectures, practical's, tutorials and seminars is unsatisfactory, their names will not be retained on the College Rolls with effect from the beginning of the Second Term of the academic year.'

4. In case of illness, a student shall apply for leave by post as soon as possible with a doctor's certificate attached with the application and shall report himself/herself to the Principal immediately after resuming attendance.

- 5. In case of Science students the term of terms shall not be deemed as kept and shall not be granted unless the student produces at the end of the term his/her laboratory journal in his/ her Science subjects duly signed by respective Heads of Science departments and wherever Tutorials are prescribed, a certificate each from the respective Heads of Departments stating that the student has completed the Tutorial course in the concerned subject.
- 6. Students of Science classes are required to wear aprons (white) while working in the Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Microbiology laboratories.

7. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the College Campus.

- 8. In the case of Arts and Commerce students the term or terms shall not be deemed as kept and shall not be granted unless the student produces at the end of the term, a certificate each from the Heads of respective Departments stating that the student has completed the prescribed tutorial/Practical work.
- 9. Student shall not attend classes other than their own without the permission of the Principal.
- 10. Conduct of students in the classes as well as on the premises of the college shall be such as will cause no disturbance to the fellow-students or to other classes.
- 11. Students shall not loiter in the College premises during Lecture/Practical hours.
- 12. Smoking in the college premises is strictly prohibited.
- 13. Students shall do nothing either inside or outside the college that will in any way interfere with orderly administration and discipline.
- 14. No society or association shall be formed in the college and no person invited to address a meeting without the Principal's permission.
- 15. No student shall collect any money as contribution for picnic, trip, educational visits, get-together, study-notes, charity or any other activity without the prior sanction of the Principal.
- 16. In the college debates and at other meetings, the chair shall be taken by a responsible person approved by the Principal and the subject of debates shall have the previous approval of the Principal.
- 17. No student shall be allowed to take active part in current politics.
- 18. No student shall communicate any information or write to the Press about matters dealing with the college administration.
- 19. Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and to help in keeping the premises neat and tidy. Causing damage to the property of the college, e.g. defacing

walls and doors, damaging fittings or breaking furniture, etc. is a breach of discipline and will be duly punished.

- 20. Students should not leave behind their books, valuables and other belongings when they go out of the laboratories / common rooms/ class rooms.
- 21. The college is not responsible for lost property. Students should deposit lost property found by them at the Library counter. The owner should claim it at the Library counter on the following day.
- 22. Vehicles (2-wheeler) brought by the students will be parked at the owners' risk, in the place provided for parking. The college is not responsible for the theft of vehicles or any damage to them.
- 23. Students applying for Certificates, testimonials etc. and those requiring the Principal's signature on any kind of document or application should first contact the Registrar of the college. No paper should be brought by students directly to the Principal for his/her signature.
- 24. If, for any reason, the continuance of a student in the college is, in the opinion of the Principal, detrimental to the best interests of the college, the Principal may ask such a student to leave the college without giving any reasons.
- 25. Students joining the college are expected to accept and observe all the Rules and Regulations of the college to the best satisfaction of the Principal.
- 26. Matters not covered by the existing rules shall rest at the discretion of the Principal.
